Clearly the generosity of the Cremer Family combined with the need for a space for older adults resulted in the development of Sun Prairie's first and only senior center. Unlike the majority of senior centers in Wisconsin, the Colonial Club has always operated as an independent 501c3 organization and as such, we have the option to take on programs and services that may be a bit out of the ordinary.

The Adult Day Center is great example of that. Those behind the development of the program took advantage of a unique service idea, withstood the criticisms of offering such a program and gave families in need a local resource. Providing on site care and support while allowing individuals to return home and sleep in their own bed at night, is a rare option for families.

Likewise, a group of older adults in 1987 decided a special event was needed to raise funds for the activities department...and StrawberryFest was born. Thirty years later, this one of kind fundraiser continues to be a crucial component of our fundraising efforts.

ADULT DAY CENTER

The ability to remain in your own home as you age is crucial. The Colonial Club's Adult Day Center plays a critical role in allowing families to keep their loved ones at home. In 2016, 15,288 hours of care and support were delivered by the caring professionals of the Adult Day Center.



Dolores has been a regular participant at ADC for over 5 years and finds the social aspect very rewarding.

Dolores (left with Dave & cat Scooter) says "Mary, Aileen and Elaine are special and gifted in working with us. The volunteers that drop in regularly are talented and everyone looks

forward to their visit. They range from young school classes to an 88 year piano player I could listen to all day. I am also an animal lover so the visits by the dogs really are a special. They even have their own trading cards."

NUTRITION

A key component that allows people to remain in their own homes is access to healthy nutrition. Whether it's an on-site congregate meal or a home delivered meal, the Colonial Club produced over 30,241 meals in 2016. Sharon has been part of our nutrition program since 2013 and has been enjoying the hot nutritious meals just about every day. Shortly after she started eating meals with us, she became a "bread packer" for the home delivered meal program.

"The food is made in a way that is tasteful, full of flavor and with a good variety of foods. This is my main meal of the day, it has made it easier for me at home, then I just have a salad at night time. I have enjoyed the socialization; they are a very social group and enjoy talking with them. I have been recommending the meals to others to come and enjoy." CASE MANAGEMENT

Case Management provides one-on-one assistance for older adults and can include anything from complex paperwork help to home repairs. In 2016, case managers provided 2,458 hours of support. Emma (left), was a recipient of case management services from Peggy Draeger (right).



"When I came to Sun Prairie I didn't know the Colonial Club existed. I met my Case Manager and she helped me find transportation to medical appointments and rides to Colonial Club for lunch. When I was recovering from surgery, she had meals delivered to my home. We [older adults] need a place to just go sit and talk with other people. I love the Colonial Club."

TRANSPORTATION


The ability to get around once someone has given up their driver's license is crucial in maintaining independence. Over 32,932 miles were logged in transporting older adults in Northeast Dane County during 2016. In 2016, the Department of Transportation 5310 program, the Madison Community Foundation, the Sun Prairie Rotary Club & their District office and Cress Funeral & Cremation Service contributed funds that allowed the purchase of 2 brand new vehicles. One vehicle is an 11-passenger, 2 wheelchair accessibility bus and the other (pictured) is a 2016 4-passenger, 2 wheelchair



SUPPORTIVE HOME CARE

Many people find it useful to have in-home support. Supportive home care aides can do light housekeeping, meal prep and errands for an older adult who otherwise might have to move to assisted or nursing home care. In 2016, demand for this service continued to increase and aides provided 5,578 hours of in-home care and support.





We started providing services to Phyllis in February 2016. It was difficult for her to complete home tasks and some personal care, as she is in a wheelchair. She was talking with a friend, explaining all of that to her friend and the friend recommended she call Colonial Club. Phyllis stated, "I am so grateful that Dee comes and helps me, she does so many tasks for me, I call her my Merry Sunshine. Dee always comes with a smile and always willing to help me, no task is too difficult for Dee. I don't know what I would do without someone from the Colonial Club. You call her a "Dee", but she is an A+ in my book"

VOLUNTEERS/ACTIVITIES

Like all nonprofit organizations, the Colonial Club could not function without the kindness and generosity of volunteers. In 2016, 397 people actively participated in various volunteer efforts, logging 12,101 hours of service. In addition to volunteers, many individuals come to the Colonial Club for continuing education and socialization.
